The nursing home facility will provide dozens of new jobs, from RN's, CNA's, Dietary Aides, and Housekeeping to Food Services, Laundry and more. The job fair will be held 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. at the Wicoicaga Tribal Community Center. Use the east entrance of the building at 503 W Broad Avenue. The new nursing home facility on the southwest side of Flandreau will be home to dozens of residents and as shown above, is nearing completion.



Growing Native Nations Cannabis brand

If you've driven at all down Veterans Avenue past the Native Nations medical marijuana dispensary recently, you've most likely noticed an increasing amount of activity on the Tribal campus. The construction happening currently is on a new and second cultivation facility as business remains not only steady but growing. Native Nations officials say they see between 300-500 people per day from all across the state, region and country come. There is often a line out the door before the dispensary opens and a limit on what consumers can buy to ensure there is something for all who do make the trip. The current production facility is simply maxed out. Additional plans for expansion continue locally, but that is far from the reach the Flandreau Santee Sioux hope and plan to have with the Native Nations Cannabis brand. "For some time the Shopko building in Mitchell has sat empty," said Tribal Spokesman David Kills-a-Hundred. "The Tribe saw an opportunity to be proactive with expanding...and Mitchell Mayor Bob Everson

has shown enthusiasm for the Tribes new business venture, which could generate as many as 70 jobs. Of course using it for that purpose depends completely on when the state of South Dakota decriminalizes Marijuana. Should that happen the tribe fully intends to work within the guidelines set by the State of South Dakota."

For the past couple of years, conversations and partnerships have also been growing with other tribal leaders and nations across the country. FSST officials will be traveling again this coming week for visits with other nations. The intent is to arm as many tribal leaders as possible with a system they say is repeatable, safe, consistent, and profitable.



Burshiem finishes prep career second at State A

SIOUX FALLS – Flandreau's Keva Burshiem shot a three-over 74 on Tuesday to finish in second place in the Class A Girls State Golf Tournament at Bakker Crossing Golf Course.

Burshiem shot 14-over total in the two rounds and was one stroke off of Canton's Olivia Sorlie, who won the individual tournament. Burshiem and Sorlie were tied heading into the final three holes and Burshiem had double bogey on 16 and Sorlie had just a bogey to take a one-stroke lead.

Burshiem then had a bogey on 17 and Sorlie had a par to push it to a two-stroke lead. Sorlie had a bogey on 18, but Burshiem was only able to get a par and Sorlie took home the title.

Sioux Falls Christian won the team portion with a total team score of 125-over. Vermillion came in second (+133) and Canton came in third (+162). Winner Area finished in fourth (+200) and Madison rounded out the top-five (+200).

The two were recognized for the time they have served in tribal leadership, the changes and achievements they've fostered, decisions made, and the personal sacrifices each has made, both in regard to time away from family and time spent on the job.

"The Executive Committee wanted to recognize both their sacrifices and achievements," FSST Communications Specialist David Kills-a-Hundred told the Moody County Enterprise. "To see not just one person given a robe but two, that is a high and rare honor."



Zachary Crow

August 18, 1985 - June 4, 2022



On June 4, 2022, Zachary Delano Crow quietly jumped on the wings of the Eagle to join friends and family in the spirit world. He was born right before midnight on August 18, 1985, in Flandreau, SD. Shortly thereafter, his family moved

to Pipestone, MN where he resided for the next 5 years before returning to Flandreau. Zach then attended Spafford Elementary, McCrossan Boys Ranch, and Springfield where he received his education and valuable life skills to strategize his future endeavors. While a youngster Zach liked to sneak a smoke with his Tahansi Skye Nelson and his best buddy Marshall Cochran-Allen. (RIP) They did this all the time. As a young man, Zach worked for the Flandreau Santee Sioux Tribe with the Maintenance Department and also at "Allen's Auto" with Victor Allen as one of his passions was old cars. He also shared this passion with his Deksi and namesake Conrad Delano Redearth. Zach was genuine in his concern for others as he demonstrated by running a taxi service for those who shouldn't have otherwise been driving. A local police officer was quoted as saying, "Zach was a valuable asset to the Flandreau Community by driving people to and home from the bars." Zach also enjoyed 60's - 70's rock music like AC/DC and Jim Morrison and CHEESEBURGERS. But he especially loved Elvis Presley's gospel songs. Zach was also happy and willing to help anyone in need often cutting himself short to help another out. He was a very generous person, selfless. Zach was a very kind-hearted, thoughtful and respectful person towards everyone, a loving young man. He also liked to joke around and tease his family and friends. He was known for his quick wit and humor, he always had people laughing. But when Zach himself laughed it caused a twinkle in his eyes to intensify the beautiful green color they were. Zach was a good friend, a good son, brother, uncle and cousin. Zach was very proud of his only niece Melodie Mae and her son SeKani John Delano Crow named in honor of her uncles. Zach fought the good fight with his health issues, he fought it with courage, strength, and humility, never complaining. He was a good person, a good Dakota man. People that were always there for him were Bunny Allen, Lindsey Morrow, Joe Blackwolf, Kevin Payer, Robin Rederth, Willie Schrader, Perry Lufkins, Paul Corcoran, Aaron Fisherman and Franceilia Hammer.

After months of wondering who the winner would be in a drawn-out game of Chase the Ace, Flandreau finally has an answer.

Tom Hansen, a local business owner had his ticket drawn last Thursday. Hansen himself was away, running the concession stand at Flandreau City Park. An employee of his, Norman Hurt, however, chose the winning card for his boss.

Hansen and the Team of Angels, the Moody County-based nonprofit that the fundraiser was held for, ultimately each walked away with \$32,475. The organization each year hosts a Chase the Ace event to help assist Moody County area families facing major medical events. Team of Angels provides reimbursement of \$.35 per mile for travel to and from appointments, up to \$750 each year.

Few ever expected the jackpot to get to where it did. Crowds grew each week as a result, and over the past couple of months, excited ticket holders spilled over onto the street and neighboring sidewalks. Mike Witte, a committee member for the organization, said that it was a great run, and they're happy for Hansen. But they all plan to take a break while they decide when and where they may do it again. The organization, in the meantime, has a golf outing fundraiser scheduled for July 16th at River's Bend Country Club.





Weekend nets drug arrest

A 62-year-old man is behind bars after a significant drug bust over the weekend, with the list of charges against him likely to grow.

The initial arrest followed the man reportedly leaving some things behind at Royal River Casino on Saturday. Among the items left behind, according to both Tribal and Flandreau City Police, was some cocaine. Officer Taylor White with City Police located the man a short distance away. The suspect was initially arrested for possession of a controlled substance, ingestion of a controlled substance, possession of marijuana, and possession of drug paraphernalia.

A judge set a cash bond of \$1,000.

It wasn't long after the arrest, however, that Sergeant Rob Neuenfeldt with Flandreau City Police applied for and was granted multiple search warrants for the suspects property and residence. The suspect was someone that local authorities had been aware of for some time in regard to possible drug activity.

Working with Tribal Police and the Moody County Sheriff's Office, the search warrant turned up a large amount of drugs packaged for distribution. Among the findings were approximately 3.8 ounces of methamphetamine, marijuana, cocaine, psilocybin mushrooms, prescription medications, cutting agents, and other miscellaneous drug paraphernalia, including sale receipts and cash. The man now faces a \$10,000 cash bond with additional felony and misdemeanor charges likely to follow.

A social media post of the bust netted numerous responses by



members of the local community
— among them, a question posed
by Tracii Barse. Barse initially
stated, "Gotta stop letting these
guys out right away. Same ones
telling on each other to get out
just keep doing it again. So it's
making all the hard work our officers are doing pointless. Great
job to the officers and thank you
for your protective work. But
what else can we do to help keep
all this from coming right back?"

Additional discussion on the thread had Barse further share the following thoughts, "We have been burying a lot of people we all love here because of this stuff. And it's like they're only getting younger and younger. I'm looking for suggestions as to help here within Flandreau SD. Helping the kids. Helping each other. You see addiction in your homes, you gotta try to get it out. We have no homeless people here standing on street corners so these people gotta be doing all of this somewhere right? Each home has a person, who has a voice, we gotta let them know it's ok to be strong enough to speak up against it. I'm not afraid to speak out against it.

I went through it for years. Everyone knows me and how I used to be. So I know it's possible to take action against addiction and to have a strong circle of support to keep going forwards. We have no AA NA programs here and if we do I haven't heard of them yet. We could also let people know it's ok to reach out to those of us who work in our community. There's just gotta be some way more we can help. Baby steps maybe and keep taking bigger steps?"

Barse's story in and of itself, and how he's hoping to have a positive impact on local youth, is something we plan to run in an upcoming edition of the Moody County Enterprise. But the conversation overall is one many in the community want to have. What are the solutions and is it even possible to stem the tide of potentially deadly narcotics coming into local communities.
