Joesph Robinson

After visiting the Moody County Historical Society, 1 was able to locate information relating to the Robinson family, who were among the first Dakota homesteaders, that came to the area after converting to Christianity and taking up agriculture as a way of life.


Joesph Robinson was the grandson of Peter Robinson also known as Tasunkemaza (His Iron Dog), who during the Dakota War of 1862, saved two white women and two white children from the Dakota Akicita's attack, earning him the nick name of "Friend of the Whites."


According to the archives, Joesph Robinson was a single man born around 1880, who was devoted to his family. At an early age he had an incredible eye for detail as exhibited from his 5th Grade pencil art that has survived to this day. Some members remember Joesph as a handsome man, small in stature and always walking to and from the Robinson homestead located north of town.

Joesph Robinson was a devoted family man, who took care of his elderly grandparents, Peter and Mary Robinson until they departed this world. It seem quite Ironic and fitting to honor a man who spent his life caring for his elders by officially naming our Long Term Care Facility designed to care for our elders in the modern era.

On Thursday, April 24, 2025, we held a Founder's Day Celebration commemorating the originial 25 founders and their families. President Reider and Vice President Weddell gave opening remarks followed by a prayer delivered by Reverend John Bursheim. Guest enjoyed a fantastic feast prepared by Chef Dominique whose Catering and Banquet facility is located in Sioux Falls, SD.



Chef Dominque featured a Roasted Beef Sirloin Carving Station, Roasted Potatoes seasoned with Lemon, Rosemary & Thyme, Grilled Lemongrass Asparagus, French Baguettes with whipped butter and a Mini Hazelnut Death by Chocolate Cake to round the meal off.



Each name on the 1896 census was recorded separately on a small plaque. Four tribal elders in attendance were randonmly selected by drawing pre-numbered tickets. Bruce Allen, Bunnie Corcoran, Delores Allen and Raymond Redwing were drawn, they in turn drew one plaque identifying a name of one of our founding members.
